

eLearning Courses FAQ

1. What are the benefits of e-learning?

- No Set schedule or deadlines. People can learn at their own pace, and at their own convenience.

2. What is a Learning Management System (LMS)

An LMS (Learning Management System) is a learning software designed to deliver, track and certify eCourses and training. ELearning is the online delivery of training with real time tracking of training results, optimizing time and reducing costs associated with traditional learning methods. ELearning courses, or eCourses, are the actual training product that typically run on a Learning Management System, an LMS.

3. What are the benefits to universities, colleges, organizations and individuals in subscribing to the Minerva e-courses and certificate program?

4. What are the features of Minerva's H&S online certificate program and LMS?

7. How does someone access Minerva's eLearning Courses?

You can access the Minerva eCourses in one of three ways:

- Through the university, college or organizational learning platform/management system and where a Minerva licensing agreement exists with these organizations.
- Through the Minerva Learning management system for organizations who have decided not to use their own learning platform and who have a licensing agreement with Minerva.
- Through the Minerva Storefront found on the Bluedrop Skills Pass platform.
- Through other learning platforms used by Minerva's partners who have been given access to the Minerva modules.

Everyone who wishes to access Minerva's online courses through the Minerva LMS will need a user ID and password to access the courses on the Minerva Canada Learning Management system found <https://login.minervaonline.ca>,

8. How can the Minerva online Health and Safety courses and modules benefit business firms?

- The four online courses with its [28 modules](#) cover a variety of Health and Safety topics that can be used by firms who have minimal H&S training for new employees, for JHSC employees, for new supervisors, as well as for middle and senior management. They can also be used to enhance existing H&S industry training programs or some programs that are mandated by provincial governments.
- The Minerva Storefront on the Bluedrop platform allows business firms to select any of the four online courses as well an introductory course containing 9 of the 28 modules. Minerva's pilot training over the past year with this introductory course was very well received with a 90% level of satisfaction on expectations met and new knowledge, skills acquired.
- A certificate is provided upon successful completion.
- Minerva online training can be considered for professional development training.

9. What are the Minerva Canada licensing and eLearning course fees?

- Minerva Canada's licensing fees for Canadian post secondary teaching institutions will depend on the number of students enrolled in accessing one or more of the modules as well as if the institution's learning platform will be used. For student enrollment under 400 using the institution's learning platform, annual licensing fees are \$4,000. For 400 or more students accessing the modules on the institution's learning platform, licensing fees will vary from 5-10 dollars per student per year. Licensing agreements are for 3 years with option to terminate after years 1 and 2. Students will be given access to any of the available Minerva Canada eLearning Courses and its individual modules. Minerva should be contacted at minerva@safetymanagementeducation.com) to discuss the best licensing arrangement available to your university, college or organization.
- Starting in July 2023, students enrolled in a Canadian post secondary teaching institution that does not have a Minerva Canada licensing agreement, can also access each of Minerva Canada's eLearning courses on the Minerva Storefront for a special course fee and receive a certificate on completion. - Professional association members, company employees and others can also access each of Minerva Canada's eLearning courses on the Minerva Storefront. Fees for any of the four online courses can vary from \$350 to \$475 depending on the group size. Total fees from \$975-\$1100 would apply if an organization chooses to do all four online courses.
